**Clinical Management of HIV** provides a global perspective on the diagnoses and clinical management of HIV. Learn from experts in the field, who provide real world examples of diagnosing and treating HIV and STIs in both resource-rich and resource-constrained settings, with a focus on using US-based guidelines. Together with participants from more than 30 other countries, you'll work through over 70 case studies.

## Format

This online graduate-level course has video lectures, readings, discussion forums, and quizzes.

You can participate in this course as an independent participant or as part of a site with five or more people. We encourage participation as a group because it provides a forum for discussing course concepts and applying them to the local setting and customs. If you can't join a group, the discussion boards can provide that forum.

The course is taught in English.
